AP Classes and Tests

Next year seniors will be taking at least 1 AP Test, which allows them a chance to earn college credit while in high school, saving a lot of money for a student's college education. These tests have a fee associated with them and will occur in the AP Testing Window in May 2021.

Financial Aid

Every student is <u>REQUIRED</u> to complete their financial aid application. To do that, make sure there is a plan to file you and your parent(s) taxes for "2020." Students will work in Senior Seminar to understand the following:

- What is financial aid and how it works.
- How to apply for financial aid and what resources exist to help pay for college

All Things Testing

Timeline for Student College Choice — Seniors will spend the fall semester applying to colleges and they are due to get their decisions between November and late March. The national deadline for students to select their college is May 1st, and we will work to meet those deadlines with our student's college choice.

Test Optional Admissions — means colleges allow all or some applicants to decide whether to submit SAT or ACT® scores as part of their application. There are 3 scenarios for this option:

- 1. Test-optional admissions policy for some applicants (GPA min.)
- 2. Test-optional admissions policy for all
- 3. Test-optional admissions, but required for enrollment or scholarships

<u>Please Note</u>: Test optional does not mean EASIER admissions—be sure to check the college website for their specific requirements for test optional admissions

Fit & Match


College Fit — Characteristics about a college to help show students how comfortable the setting could potentially be.
